## Course Outline

This is a fully accredited course for students wishing to enter the heavy road transport industry or for current employees wishing to gain a formal qualification for their existing skills. This is a competency based assessment course that is primarily delivered in the workplace. The course allows students to gain practical skills and knowledge to effectively participate in workplaces that maintain, service and repair heavy road vehicles. Heavy road vehicles have a GVM (Gross Vehicle Mass) greater than 4.5 tonnes and include trucks, b-doubles and buses.

## Duration

- 2 year full time course
- Attendance is 2.5 consecutive days per week to allow students to gain work in the Industry while they study

## Career Opportunities

This course provides the student with the skills of a Repairer/mechanic for heavy road transport vehicles. Other opportunities may include: Automotive business manager, fixed operations manager, sales manager, parts manager, purchasing manager, automotive aftermarket, retail sales manager or warehouse manager. There is a significant skills shortage in Australia in the automotive industry, and Chisholm graduates are highly sought after. - Carry out oxy acetylene weld/thermal cut/heat
- Carry out gas metal arc (MIG) weld product
- Test engines using a dynamometer
- Manage people performance
- Prepare budgets and financial plans

A key feature of Chisholm's automotive courses is the integrated language and cultural units. Students spend 40 hours on topics such as industry language, Australian work culture, resume development and interview skills, which assist our students to get jobs and thrive in the work force.

The department has an active student body, with many extra curricular activities including: trips to the Melbourne Motor Show, BBQs, and the Track Program at Sandown racetrack. The department also has a student forum, which represents the views and ideas of the student body to staff.
