The Mechanical Technology stream (also known as Mechanical Light Vehicle) of Chisholm's Diploma of Automotive Management provides the skills and competencies related to vehicle mechanics, and management skills required for the automotive industry. Quality Education

Chisholm's automotive classes are very small – with only 14 students in each practical class and a maximum of 20 in each academic class. Each student has optimum access to staff and has the opportunity to get a lot of hands on practical experience. Live work is done in class, with many students bringing in their own cars to work on.

A key feature of Chisholm's automotive courses is the integrated language and cultural units. Students spend 40 hours on topics such as industry language, Australian work culture, resume development and interview skills, which assist our students to get jobs and thrive in the work force.

The department has an active student body, with many extra curricular activities including: trips to the Melbourne Motor Show, BBQs, and the Track Program at Sandown racetrack. The department also has a student forum, which represents the views and ideas of the student body to staff.
