Overview

This is a humanities based course that aims to develop general knowledge and skills for effective participation at university in the arts and social sciences. The course also develops competencies for the workplace where advanced communication skills and a broad general knowledge are assets.

The course can allow students to transfer, with the equivalent of up to 1 year credit, into an arts/social science or teaching course at university. The course prepares students to act critically, constructively and creatively in further study, the modern workplaces, and both personal and public life. Study areas include: psychology, sociology, philosophy, political studies, history, economics and environmental studies. Students develop skills in essay writing, reviews, written research reports, oral presentations and practical written exams.

The VCE (Victorian Certificate of Education) represents the completion of secondary schooling (Years 11 and 12) in the state of Victoria, Australia. The certificate prepares students to gain entry to further study at Chisholm, another TAFE institute or at university.

VCE can also improve your employment prospects, encourage personal development, and provide students with skills in a number of subject areas.

VCE is made up of units 1 and 2 in year 11 and units 3 and 4 in year 12. Five subjects are studied at each level.

Chisholm offers a range of subjects through the business and science streams of study or a general VCE at either Chisholm Dandenong or Chisholm Frankston. The Business stream is studied at Chisholm Dandenong and the Science stream is studied at the Chisholm Frankston.

The VCE (Victorian Certificate of Education) represents the completion of secondary schooling (Years 11 and 12) in the state of Victoria, Australia.

Students who have completed the equivalent of Year 10 in their home countries can undertake this course which prepares them for entry into Year 12 VCE. Also, some Chisholm courses offer admission after Year 11.

Five subjects consisting of units 1 and 2 are completed in this course. Applicants must demonstrate satisfactory maths, written, listening and verbal comprehension and communication skills.

Unit 2 subjects commence in July. July admission is only applicable to students who have completed equivalent Year 11 study.
